



## COVID-19 Policy

**Due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, Twin Brooks has implemented the following guidelines for horse shows to align with recent CDC guidelines.**

1. If you are not feeling well, running a fever or have been near someone diagnosed or suspected of having COVID-19 in the past two weeks, STAY HOME!
2. Face masks are not required but are strongly encouraged.
3. Entries must be completed online or away from the secretary stand. There will be blank forms available but they must be taken back to your vehicle/trailer to be completed and then you must return to the secretary stand. All forms are available on our website [www.tbhsa.com](http://www.tbhsa.com). Only one representative per exhibitor should come to the secretary stand to enter. Entrants should be spaced 6 ft. apart while waiting in line. A complete entry consists of an entry form, signed liability waiver, current Coggins within one year and cash or check for payment. We strongly encourage open checks to minimize contact.
4. Ribbons will not be handed out in the ring. You may collect your ribbons from the gate or at the office.
5. Spectators should be limited and we ask that you spread out. Do not congregate at the gate and between the rings. Only exhibitors in the upcoming classes should be near the ring with their trainer and family. All other exhibitors should remain at their trailer or in the designated spectator areas spaced out along the ringside.
6. Restrooms will be open and cleaned prior to the show. We have soap and running water in the main restrooms. Sanitizer will be available in the porta john. Wash or sanitize your hands often.
7. Our food stand will be open for carry out. Please spread out 6 ft. apart while waiting to place your order. Do not stand in groups to order. Combine orders as much as possible to limit congestion around the food stand.
8. Remember that we are a volunteer organization navigating uncharted territories. We will do our best to make our shows enjoyable while maintaining mandated safety guidelines. Stay safe and have fun!
